Identify the risks

- **Emotional crisis:** Contact the Dean of Students Affairs or the Counselor.
- If the situation involves violence, weapons, aggressions, drugs or alcohol: Call the Bayamon Security Guards.

Tips

Prevention

- 1. Do not stay alone in a classroom, use the library.
